CHARACTER COUNTS

Intrigue Gin is full of character and botanicals, with a subtle citrus focus. For centuries the juniper branch and citrus fruits have been used to represent gin. A hand drawn image of citrus fruits graces our label for Intrigue, as well as the Isle of Whidbey Label on the rear.

ABV: 44% / 88 Proof

Handmade in small batches on the Isle of Whidbey, Washington.

Distilled from Grain - 18th Century Recipe.

Nose: Intrigue Gin is full of character and botanicals, with an attenuated citrus focus.

Tasting Notes: Refreshing flavors on the palate. Slightly off dry.
Moderated juniper and coriander with a citrus focus.

Multiple botanicals are engaged in this Gin, giving this smooth-yet-crisp spirit a flavor profile you will not forget, and will be asking for more.



DUTCH COURAGE

Gin was developed on the basis of the older Jenever, and became popular in Scotland when William III, leader of the Dutch Republic, occupied the Scottish thrones with his wife, Mary. Gin is one of the broadest categories

of spirits, represented by products of various origins, styles, and flavor profiles that all revolve around juniper as a common ingredient. The Dutch physician Franciscus Sylvius is often falsely credited with the invention of gin in the mid 17th century. However, the existence of genever is found in Philip Massinger's play The Duke of Milan (1623), when Sylvius would have been about nine years old. It is further claimed that British soldiers who provided support in Antwerp against the Spanish in 1585, during the Eighty Years' War, were already drinking genever for its calming effects before battle, from which "Dutch Courage" is believed to have originated.



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
